The Company intends to finance these acquisitions by using available cash from operations and through incurrence of bridge or other debt financing, either of which may increase the Company’s leverage ratios, or by issuing equity, which may have a dilutive impact on existing shareholders proportionate ownership. At any given time the Company may be engaged in a number of discussions that may result in one or more material acquisitions. These opportunities require confidentiality and may involve negotiations that require quick responses by the Company. Although there is uncertainty that any of these discussions will result in definitive agreements or the completion of any transactions, the announcement of any such transaction may lead to increased volatility in the trading price of the Company’s securities.

Appendix



Definition of Non-GAAP Measures

- **EBITDA:** EBITDA is a non-GAAP measure, that represents operating profit plus depreciation and amortization and stock-based compensation.
- **MDC's Share of EBITDA:** MDC's Share of EBITDA is a non-GAAP measure, that represents operating profit plus depreciation and amortization and stock-based compensation less net income attributable to noncontrolling interests.
- **Organic Growth:** Organic revenue growth is a non-GAAP measure that refers to growth in revenues from sources other than acquisitions or foreign exchange impacts.
- **Free Cash Flow:** Free cash flow is a non-GAAP measure that represents MDC EBITDA less capital expenditures, net, less cash interest, net, less cash taxes.
- **Net Bank Debt:** Debt due pertaining to the revolving credit facility plus debt pertaining to the Term Loan A plus debt due pertaining to the Term Loan B less total cash and cash equivalents.
